1. Overarching and related functions of IPBES

Four main related functions of IPBES:

- Knowledge generation
- Regular and timely assessments
- Support policy formulation and implementation
- Capacity building



1. Guiding principles

Including:


- Independent intergovernmental body;
- Scientifically independent, credible, relevant and legitimate;
- Policy-relevant but not policy-prescriptive;
- Recognise regional contexts and needs;
- Take a bottom up approach
- Full and effective participation of developing countries;
- Interdisciplinary and multidisciplinary approach;
- Respect the contribution of indigenous and local knowledge;
- Address terrestrial, marine and inland water biodiversity and ecosystem services and their interactions.



2. Additional considerations

To enable delivery of work programme:

- Process for making requests and setting priorities
- Importance of building on existing initiatives
- Consideration of strategic partnerships
- Consideration of early achievements
- Need for draft terms of reference for activities proposed
- Ensuring coherence in implementation
- Communications
- Monitoring and evaluation
- Other issues: additional procedures; subsidiary bodies; secretariat support.
